


Virtual Playbook Revisions

Revision 1: Develop mobile version



Current:

The current version of the *Virtual Playbook* is developed for a larger device like a laptop or tablet.


New:

The new version of the program will be created for mobile devices as well.

Reason:

One of the testers mentioned that they would use the training more often if it was mobile friendly. Mobile phones are more accessible in general as well.

Revision 2: Replace Quiz



Current:

The last practice in the *Virtual Playbook* is a multiple choice quiz that covers all the course content.


New:

The new version of the program will replace the quiz with a more interactive activity that reviews the different plays and terminology. The activity will be similar to the formations activity.

Reason:

Both testers felt the quiz was not helpful in memorization and could be replaced with something more engaging.

Revision 3: Increase Navigation



Current:

The current version of the *Virtual Playbook* requires users to click return buttons back up the hierarchy of menus.


New:

The new version of the program will have buttons that link important sections directly. For example, a way to go from the terminology section straight to the practices.

Reason:

This was a common complaint from one of the participants during the evaluation.

Revision 4: Change Reveal Answer Button



Current:

In the formations creation activity, the user currently has to hover over the answer button to reveal the answer.

New:

The new version of the program will have the answer button as a clickable object to ensure a user does not accidentally see the answer.

Reason:

During testing, one participant prematurely revealed the answer a couple of times.

What would I do differently?

If I knew everything I know now, I would make the following changes:

- Remove the quiz and think of a more interactive activity.
- Change the design theme of the training to one similar to this slides deck particularly the title page. It is simple like the current design, but bolder and more engaging.
- Place more focus on the navigation pathways within the training so it can flow better. Add more directions in general.
- Make the program in the mobile format since that would increase accessibility for users.
- Organize the information in the training so that it can be more football position focused.
